How the Bible became the Bible is one of the most fascinating mysteries of all. For example, today we are going to hear words from what scholars call Jesus' *Sermon on The Plain* from the gospel of Luke. Listening carefully, we'll hear that these words sound very similar to things Jesus says in the gospel of Matthew – during a time scholars call Jesus' *Sermon on The Mount*. The two narratives have distinct differences; did Jesus give two sermons? Were Matthew and Luke present for the event and then decide to record it differently? Is Matthew more 'accurate' than Luke, or vice versa?

This is the mystery of the Bible. Historical scholarship teaches us that Matthew and Luke used similar source material in writing their gospels, which is why there are so many similarities. But in the same way that each of us might tell a similar story differently, each gospel writer tells the story of Jesus in a unique way. Does this diminish what we know and believe about Jesus? Absolutely not! In fact, this testifies to the power of the Holy Spirit and the unique experience each person has in encountering the Son of God.




