A Word About Today's Service

Christmas carols were not considered to be appropriate music in worship until the late 19th century. But in 1875 the English composer, John Stainer, introduced a pamphlet of Christmas carols to be sung during Advent and Christmas worship services at St. Paul's, London. From there, the use of Christmas carols in worship spread. In 1880, Edward White Benson, Bishop of Truro, led the first service of Lessons and Carols on Christmas Eve as a way to draw revelers out of the local pubs and into the church. The service began at 10 p.m. and about 400 worshippers attended.

Lesson and Carols tells the story of our salvation, from the time of Adam and Eve's sin to the birth of Jesus Christ. We will hear the story of the near sacrifice of Isaac and the prophet's heralding the birth of Jesus. The carols and music we sing and hear in today's service are meant to accentuate the message of holy Scripture. You are invited to sing and participate in worship as you are able, even taking time to simply soak in the message and beauty of the season. This is not just a story told yearly as tradition, but the very story in which all people have a place!
