

Today's bulletin cover artwork, *Brow of the Hill Near Nazareth* by James Tissot, depicts a dramatic moment in today's gospel lesson. After hearing Jesus teach and preach, the crowds went from amazed to enraged, trying finally to push Jesus over the edge of a cliff in Nazareth. This painting is one of 350 by the artist, depicting nearly every major event in the Gospels. Tissot, known for his urban landscape scenes of Paris and London, shocked the art world in 1896 when these works were first displayed.

Tissot spent nearly five years in and around the Holy Land researching for this collection of paintings. While there, Tissot noted an 'aura' around the physical places described in the Gospels, and he noted in his journal having mystical experiences standing in the places where Jesus may have once walked. Works such as Tissot's are a potent reminder of the many and varied ways in which we encounter the presence of God in our lives. Today's Scripture lessons help us to consider who can experience the presence of God: is it just some people or all people?
