

A Word About Today's Service

Making clear lines between who or what is 'in' and who or what is 'out' is deeply embedded in who we are as the human family. We believe we do it for safety, for the well-being of our families and communities, and for protection. But the result has been, and always will be, divisions within the human family that are not in accordance with God's will. In the least harmful situations it keeps us unaware and uninterested in who our neighbors are. In the most harmful situations it causes us to wage war against one another.

In a deeply complex world, do we have a place when it comes to judging the lives and choices of others? Our final half-truth is: *love the sinner, hate the sin.* Is this a permission we are given by God? Are there any instances in the Bible where God allows us to hate anything or anyone? What effects does this mentality have on our communities and on the world, and what is a better alternative according to Jesus Christ? These questions, and more, shape our worship today.
