

A Word About Today's Service

If you read ahead in the buelltin to today's Scripture lesson you might wonder if these words actually come from the Bible? Advice about sanitary practices and laws about how to use the bathroom? Prohibitions against Israelite men and women becoming temple prostitutes, but no prohibition on other sex workers in the temple? God giving the Israelites permission to eat as many grapes and as many handfuls of grain from their neighbors fields as they can, but prohibiting them from bringing a to-go container when they do? Is this really from the Bible?

The answer is 'yes' as we consider this half-truth: *God said it, I believe it, that settles it.* For too long we've approached interpreting the Bible as a static, non-living text, which takes away all the beauty and mystery that it contains. How did the Israelites understand these laws? Was God really concerned with where they went to the bathroom? What did Jesus have to say about the Law and how we are to interpret God's Word? These questions, and more, shape our worship today.
