

A Word About Today's Service

Today in worship we meditate on the story of a man possessed by demons, and consider this Half Truth: *God helps those who help themselves*. Mark tells us that the demon-possessed man was so strong and dangerous to the community that he was made to live in the tombs because chains and shackles could not hold him. Met with such a diabolical presence, we watch as Jesus meets the man where he is, heals him of the demons, and restores him to his rightful place in the community.

This story, and others in the Bible, challenge us to think about God's presence in our lives when we are in need and when we are not. Does God expect us to meet God 'half-way' when we have an issue that needs to be resolved. Does God reward those who 'pull themselves up by the bootstraps'? What happens to those who simply don't have boots to begin with? These questions, and more, shape our worship today.
