#### A Word About Today's Service

Grace Carol Bomer's *Return of The Prodigal* is a masterwork among the many depictions of this beloved parable. Using new and antique gold leaf, Bomer covered scarlet-painted panels of wood, over which she layered, then scratched away, various colors of paint to create the work's background movement. Using the front page of a magazine depicting a father kissing the forehead of his cancer-serving daughter, Bomer illustrates the good news of God's grace for Prodigal Sons and Prodigal Daughters. Tattooed on the Prodigal's arm are the words, "I am my beloveds and my beloved is mine," from Song of Songs 2:16.

Floating between the two characters are three Hebrew letters that form the root of the word *shaddai*, meaning 'almighty,' and one of the myriad names used for God in the Hebrew Scriptures. Could this indicate to us what happens when we forgive and love one another unconditionally? Is God present and visible in those moments? The Prodigal Son sure thought so.
