Today we begin a five-week series on one of the most beloved parables: *The Prodigal Son*. As a parable about God's grace and love, it invites us to contemplate the way we live our lives, how we encounter the living God, and what sort of transformation can happen when we fully receive God's grace. Today we consider the parable from the perspective of the younger brother who 'squandered' away his inheritance.

Today's bulletin cover is probably the most famous depiction of *The Prodigal Son*, painted in 1669 by Rembrandt. Much has been written about this work, some calling it the very height of Baroque artistry and form. It is interesting to note the composition of the piece, with the light drawing the eye to the disheveled son who has returned, and not to the father who offers forgiveness. And yet the father is by no means a 'background' character! The father's hands are clearly seen, one larger and more masculine, and the other softer and more feminine, perhaps representing the dual nature of God as mother and father. The older brother, whose face seems to be illuminated by the young brother's clothes, stands to the side with arms crossed in judgment.
