

Christ the King Sunday focuses our worship on the cosmic character of Christ's reign over the world. The day is celebrated widely in some traditions and is normally scheduled on the last Sunday before Advent, with rich biblical imagery from Daniel to Revelation. It therefore serves as a transitional Sunday leading directly into Advent, the Christmas cycle, and the new Christian year. The day fits well with the eschatological emphasis and anticipation of Christ's second coming highlighted during Advent. It also helps worshipers, who are already thinking about Christmas, to remember that Christmas is about much more than a baby in a manger - it is about a sovereign Christ who came to be the "Prince of Peace."
