A Word About Today's Service

Today we begin a three-week series called "Blessed To Be A Blessing" based on the harrowing story of Abram and Sarai in the book of Genesis. Like many characters in the Bible, Abram and Sarai were simple folks from an unknown area of the world minding their business until God came into their picture. God calls Abram and Sarai to leave the familiar behind and journey with God into an unknown future. In faith, Abram and Sarai answer God's call and their world completely changes. How is their story similar to our own? What can their faith teach us about our faith?

"Blessed To Be A Blessing" is also the theme of our 2023 Stewardship Campaign. As we learn more about Abram and Sarai, we are also asked to consider how we will support First Presbyterian Church in the year of ministry and mission ahead. Like Abram and Sarai, we are called to step out in the faith with our gifts of time, talent, and treasure – in what ways has God blessed each of us that we might be a blessing to others?


The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Jesus Christ came into the world to save sinners.
