A Word About Today's Service

The Parable of The Shrewd Manager, which is at the heart of our worship service today, is wonderfully depicted on the bulletin cover by Dutch artist Reymerswaele. In this scene, the scheming and conniving is thick in the air, yet we do not know which figure is the manager and which is the debtor. In the background we can see the rest of the parable unfold as the shrewd, or dishonest, manager continues the scheme. This parable opens up many questions about what Jesus is trying to say about God, about honesty in business, and about building the kingdom of God. Does Jesus expect us to be as shrewd or dishonest as the manager? Is he trivializing the importance of honest financial practices as an extension of our faith?

Perhaps the point of this parable is in the questions and not in the answers. Maybe Jesus' point in telling this strange story is to discomfort us on the way to gaining wisdom. Welcome to worship on this Lord's day!
