"But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare." - Jeremiah 29:7

Dear friends,

The summer months are off to a beautiful start here in the North Country and I want to encourage you to take full advantage of these sunny, warm days by experiencing all that our community has to offer!

I've been blessed to live in many different places and travel quite a bit. From camping in the Rocky Mountains and Wisconsin Dells, to riding the same rail line as Gandhi nearly the full length of India, to truly being able to see the curvature of the earth while driving through the Great Plains, God has opened my eyes, ears, and heart to the marvel that is God's creation. And in each place I've lived or visited, I've thought of God's command to the Israelites to 'seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you.'

The command came at a desperate time in Israel's history. The Israelites had been exiled, removed from their homeland, and, as the Psalmist recounts, made to entertain their captors with sad songs from home (Ps. 137). But even in exile, God gave the Israelites work to do. As the Chosen People - a belovedness from God that not even exile could take away - the Israelites were commanded to live well in the city where they were exiled and to pray to the Lord on its behalf. Because the simple truth is this: when you invest yourself, physically and spiritually, into the place where you are living, your life will become even more abundant.

Now, we are not living in exile. The seemingly-endless winter we just lived through might have felt like it, but we are not under occupation and we enjoy many, many freedoms. But God's truth through the words of Jeremiah still rings true: when we live well in our community, our lives increase in abundant. Here are some ways I believe we can seek the welfare of our community as people of faith:

- Check out a local farmers' market. Shop, but also strike up a conversation with one of the vendors. Learn more about their craft and help them to know that they are an important valued part of the community.
- Pack a cooler and grab a blanket for *Concert In The Park* on June 29th with the Orchestra of Northern New York and fireworks! The soul-touching music of this yearly celebration is accentuated by views of our beautiful city and magnificent Thompson Park.
- Register your kids, grandkids, and neighborhood kids for VBS—the form is included in this newsletter or you can register online at the church website. Some of my earliest memories are of Vacation Bible School and, for some kiddos, might be the only place they heard about and experience the tremendous love of God!
- Vote! There are primary elections all over Jefferson County on June 27, with early voting taking place at the Jefferson County Office Building June 17-25.
- Visit the lake or the river, even just for a few hours. When you consider the age and expanse of these natural wonders, it is humbling and convicting. I've never left either place without wondering what I could do to help preserve them for future generations.

- Take a walk or a hike, around your neighborhood or at a local park. Your physical health is just as important to God as your spiritual health!
- Join a club, volunteer, or serve on a committee. I know, I know, I know...we're all pressed for time. But what I've found is that I actually have more time when I give some of it away to an important cause or group.
- Worship. Of course I hope you worship at First Pres every week, but take a Sunday or two to visit a different church. Listen and learn how other people experience God and then consider how that can enrich your own faith.
- Pray. Pray without ceasing. Pray for our local leaders to make wise decisions for the good of all. Pray for me and your Elders and faith leaders everywhere that our witness might bring many to faith. Pray for our teachers and school administrators and everyone who has a hand in forming coming generations. Pray for those whose work goes unnoticed, but without whom our lives would not be possible. Pray for the sick and the homeless and ask for God's wisdom to transform our social ills. Pray even if you don't know what to pray about. God listens.

And consider joining us for the final session of "Going Deeper" which starts on July 9. For this final session we'll be reading and discussing Dietrich Bonhoeffer's *Life Together*, which is a classic examination of the joy of Christian community. There we will read this quote, which serves both as a challenge and a benediction to us:

> "The more thankfully we daily receive what is given to us, the more assuredly and consistently will community increase and grow from day to day as God pleases."


